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**CONTRACTORS BOARD TAKES DISCIPLINARY ACTION
AGAINST THREE CONTRACTORS**

(Reno, NV) - At its meeting on December 2, 2004, the Nevada State Contractors Board adjudicated cases against three (3) licensed contractors.

William & Son, license number 16182 (General Building) based out of Carson City, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; contracting in excess of established license limit; and, failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was fined \$1,000, assessed the cost of investigation and ordered to pay restitution to the homeowner.

Spring Painting, license numbers 57664 (Painting and Decorating) based out of Sparks, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for misrepresentation of a material fact. The licensee was ordered to submit to a Business Review.*

C P Homes, license number 49405 (Residential and Small Commercial) based out of Minden, Nevada was found in violation of Nevada Revised Statute 624 for substandard workmanship; failure to comply with a notice to correct; failure to keep in force a bond or cash deposit; failure to provide required Residential Recovery Fund disclosures; failure to provide disclosures required by a general building contractor; failure to include license number and monetary limit on a contract or proposal; and, failure to establish financial responsibility. The licensee was fined \$3,500, assessed the cost of investigation and ordered to make corrective repairs or pay restitution to the homeowner.

**The Business Review Program is one in which contractor's business practices and regulatory compliance is examined by NSCB investigative staff. The program is a part of NSCB's proactive investigative efforts.*

The Nevada State Contractors Board is committed to protecting the public's health, safety, and welfare through licensing and regulation of the construction industry. Under Nevada Revised Statutes, a licensee is subject to disciplinary action by the Board for failure to comply with the requirements of the laws or regulations governing contractors. Violations may result in Board action against the contractor's license. The State Contractors Board has the power to regulate contractors and discipline licensees who violate NRS 624. Disciplinary action may consist of a fine of up to \$10,000 per offense, order corrective action, suspension, revocation or other action.

The Board will convene next in Henderson, NV on December 7, 2004.
