NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Workshop and Hearing for the Adoption, Amendment or Repeal of Regulations of

The State of Nevada Contractors Board

The State of Nevada Contractors Board (Board) will conduct a public workshop on Monday, December 1. 2014 at 9:00 a.m. and a public hearing on Wednesday, December 10, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. The workshop and hearing will be video-conferenced between the Board's Henderson office located at 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 and the Reno office located at 9670 Gateway Drive, Suite 100, Reno, Nevada, 89521.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.060 and 233B.0603:

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment.
 - The purpose of proposed regulation is to amend Chapter 624 of the Nevada Administrative Code to add a sub-classification to the B-General Building classification to allow remodeling and improvement of interior spaces, including structures which exceed more than three stories in height and buildings with fewer than three stories that are connected to structures which exceed three stories.
- 2. Either the terms or the substance of the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed or a description of the subjects and issues involved.

The proposed regulation adds a sub-classification to the B-General Building classification to allow remodeling and improvement of interior spaces, including structures which exceed more than three stories in height and buildings with fewer than three stories that are connected to structures which exceed three stories. A copy of the proposed regulation may be obtained by visiting our website at www.nscb.nv.gov or writing to the Board's offices.

- 3. The estimated economic effect of this proposed regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public.
 - (a) Adverse and beneficial effects.

The proposed regulation should not result in any economic impact since the scope of work currently requires licensure. The regulation will allow a broader number of licensees able to perform certain tenant improvements and therefore improve economic conditions for those members of the industry performing such work. The regulation should not result in any adverse economic effect on the general public.

(b) Both immediate and long-term effects.

The immediate and long term effect of implementing the provisions of the proposed regulation would provide the opportunity for individuals to perform a broader range of remodeling and improvement of interior spaces, therefore, benefitting both the industry and the end-user.

4. The estimated cost to the agency for the enforcement of the proposed regulation. Cost to the agency should be minimal.

5. A description of and citation to any regulations of other states or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication and overlapping is necessary.

The proposed regulation does not overlap or duplicate any regulation.

6. If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, a citation and description of the federal law.

Written submissions must be received by the Board five days prior to the scheduled workshop. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the board may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

A copy of this notice and the regulations to be adopted, amended or repealed will be on file at the State Library, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Additional copies of the notices and the regulation to be adopted will be available at the State Contractors Board 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 and the Reno office located at 9670 Gateway Drive, Suite 100, Reno, Nevada, 89521. In all counties in which an office of the Board is not maintained, a copy of this notice and the text of the proposed regulation will also be available for public inspection and copying at the main public library during business hours. Copies of this notice and the proposed regulation will also be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if deemed necessary.

Upon adoption of any regulation, the board, if requested to do so by an interested person, either before adoption or within 30 days thereafter, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.
